As we look back to the successful completion of the tenth edition, we cannot help but wonder, how this statement stands as a true testament to the TCS World 10K Bengaluru.

The tenth edition, was an example on how deep we have woven ourselves into the fabric of the city with over 24,000 registered runners on the start line at the crack of dawn, post a night of summer thunderstorms. The weather did not keep our runners away and for that, we are grateful and are reassured on how important this day is in an individual's running calendar.

Today the TCS World 10K has firmly established itself as the world's premier 10K event and over the past decade gained immense respect in the international athletic community - a commitment that was maintained when 3-time Olympic gold medallist and multiple world record holder Stephanie Rice, graced the event as the international event ambassador for the celebratory tenth edition. Her exuberance and enthusiasm were infectious - promoters, participants and sponsors, all basking in the positive energy she brought to the event.

To let the world, witness the grandeur of the elite races, we revised the race timings this year; which also allowed the amateur runners an opportunity to return to the stadium post their runs to cheer the elite runners as they finished. Korio and Irene Cheptai made it a Kenyan double, winning the race in 28:12 and 31:51 respectively, Cheptai finishing just 3 seconds off the women's course record. The Indian runners finished strongly as well, with Naveen Kumar winning the men's elite and a dominating win by Saigeeta who left her competition far behind.

This year the charity drive has broken new ground, raising record amounts for charity and underscoring the fact that the city does care. Over 91 CSO's participated in the event, garnering funds and awareness for their cause. Since its inception in 2008, the event has raised significant amounts for a range of causes, establishing itself as South India's largest fundraising platform.



French track and field sprinter who specialised in the 200 and 400 metres and was a threetime Olympic gold medalist.

























FROM THE PHILANTHROPY PARTNER'S DESK

THE EVENT'S PHILANTHROPY PILLAR

The Tata Consultancy Services World 10k Bengaluru is a great platform for thousands of runners and donors! Doctors, corporate employees, tribal children, CEOs, running groups, volunteers, staff members, board member, friends, family, differently abled - every single individual joins to spread awareness of the cause they believe in. And many run as a team - which is quite uncommon in life and in the social sector as on a day-to-day basis, it is almost impossible for all to get together and have fun!

We are amazed at how the World 10k platform has evolved since 2008. These days while so many talk about 'CSR funding', the platform of the TCS World 10k Bengaluru proves the power of 'Individual giving'. A record 83% of funds raised this year has come from individuals raising and donating funds for their chosen cause: 9,000+ donors have donated, 458 individuals have raised funds for 71 CSOs working in 11 causes.

This 2017 edition of the Event saw more CSOs reaching out to the running community with positive results; also many more Open 10k runners ran for a cause than in earlier editions of the Event. Another record was that 71 individuals who signed up as Care Champions, taking on a target from ₹ 1 lakh to ₹ 10 lakh for their cause. We are also very pleased that 30 Companies have joined in the platform to support a cause of their choice.

We also know that the funds raised in the last edition has made a difference to over 50,000 people in our society due to the utilisation reports submitted by the CSOs who used the platform in 2016.

A very nice additional feature this year is the collaboration taking place between Government, Conservationist, Cubbon Park enthusiasts, Procam International and India Cares to rejuvenate Cubbon Park. Known as the 'Çubbon Park Rejuvenation' (CPR) project we are working together to rejuvenate the water bodies in Cubbon Park which will enhance the Park in so many ways and ultimately the wellbeing of all citizens of 'Namma Bengaluru'.

The structured approach to philanthropy by Procam International and India Cares promoting caring, transparency and accountability before, during and after the Event is building the philanthropy pillar and keeping everyone involved, motivated.

Yes, the TCS World 10k is increasingly being respected as a transparent, accountable and a caring platform.





The races organised by Procam "help because there is a deadline and somehow most donors get down to making that cheque or bank transfer. A big event like this gives it a sense of importance - though the cause and the donors are the same, this somehow works. A good platform to get corporate support".

The category saw 417 runners in this edition, iCare individuals are well-wishers of CSO's; volunteers; staffor the community the CSO works with.



WASTE MANAGEMENT AT THE TCS WORLD 10K 2017

TCS World 10K continued their initiatives for an eco-friendly event this year in association with Hasiru Dala Innovations, a social enterprise that creates predictable, sustainable livelihoods for waste pickers and informal waste workers through innovative, circular economy centric businesses in India and across the world.

Initiatives that were implemented towards making this an eco-friendly event included:

Communication:

- The event has been sending only e-confirmation letters to runners via email since 2011.
- In the 10th edition of the run, all participants were encouraged to receive event related information (handbooks) in digital format. This received an over whelming response and more than 40% of the runners opted for e-handbooks.

Usage of alternate product/material:

- Plastic packaging was avoided. All the participants' running number bibs were distributed without any packaging.
 The medals were handed out in fabric pouches.
- The runner bags handed out to each runner at the expo was made of a cloth-based material rather than polyester.
- Thick paper bags were used instead of plastic carry bags.
- Wherever the use of plastics was imperative as packaging, stickers were put stating 'non degradable packing material, please dispose responsibly'

Refreshments:

 Hot refreshments were served to all the runners post their run. The entire meal was served using aracanut plates and steel spoons.

Water Service during the event:

- At all pre-race day events, water dispensers were placed for visitors to refill their bottles.
- On race day, all the runners had a choice to drink water using either the pet bottle or refill their bottles at water dispensers.

The various types of waste generated at the event

Food Waste: This includes all left over food from the plates and food left behind by caterers.

Plastic Bottles/ Pet Bottles: This includes the water bottles from all water stations serving water.

Tetrapack: This includes tetrapack covers for juices, etc.

All other dry waste: This includes paper, plastic wrappers and cardboards.

Flex waste: This includes all flex used for marketing and signage in the stadium and route.

Details of the disposal for various wastes

Transported to Bio Gas plant Nobel Exchange, Magadi Road.

Transported to Trashin Recycling Private Limited, HSR Layout. The bottles, labels and caps are recycled separately.

Transported to aggregation centre of Hasiru Dala Innovations. This is bailed and sent for recycling.

Handed over to waste pickers, identified by Hasiru Dala and BBMP. They will sort the waste into different grades and sell it to recycling supply chain for each category separately.

Transported by Swabhimaan to their workstation in Ejipura to make different products.

Aracanut Plates: This includes the plates used to serve the food at the refreshment counters.

- Post the run, excess food was distributed to 15000+ individuals in the slum areas of DJ Halli, Ejipura and Viveknagar in conjuction with Swabhimaan & India Cares Foundation.
- Swabhimaan also distributed the flex material, approximately 18,000 feet, that was used at the event, it was glued and distributed to 400 families, who will use them to protect their shanties during the rains.



 Digging of rainwater trenches to harvest rainwater to these water bodies & develop a sustainable rain water harvesting system for the water requirement of the Park.
- Placing dustbins and fencing where required
- Placing signage's of the rich history of the Trees, Wells and Birds, for us all to know the heritage of this 'heart of the city'.

A FIRST HAND ACCOUNT OF - PAYIR TRUST

First person account of Mr Ramanathan of Payir Trust, a first time participating CSO raised ₹ 6.48 lakh:

We had an amazing time in the TCS10K run on 21 May, 2016. 14 of our team members participated in the Majja run, including 10 members from our village (Thenur village in TamilNadu near Trichy), 3 volunteers from Bangalore and 1 volunteer from Chennai, 3 of our runners were children.

Our members from the village travelled 350 km the previous day to reach Bangalore. For most of them, this was their first trip to Bangalore, and their first participation in a Mega event. They were super excited at the mere thought of running 6K along with 1000s of runners from around the world. The rains were a cool welcome to them - from 45 degrees in the village in the morning to 28 degrees in Bangalore in the evening. For 2 of our children from the village, it was like travel to a fancy land.

The next morning started at 4am. The 14 of us came from 4 different locations. We assembled and wore our handmade costumes for the theme - "Eco-friendly vs Non Eco-friendly products". We were charged up on seeing the crowds, and excited to win second place in the Jabong Costume contest. After that we completed the run, and enjoyed the nice hot breakfast.

Overall it was wonderful experience for all of us, a great exposure to our staff, and a nice platform for our fund raisers to raise money. Together the total fund collection is Rs.6.5 lakh!! These funds will be utilized for our Rural Empowerment Activities reaching 25,000 people & 10,000 children from 39 panchayats for their Health, Education, Nutrition and Skills development



Fund Utilisation Report

From funds raised in the 2016 edition of TCS World 10k

It is always heartening when one knows the end result of the contributions that have been made, however small or big the donation. CSOs that utilise the platform of TCS World 10k provide the utilisation report of the funds they have raised in the earlier edition to the philanthropy partner. Over 50,000 individuals have been directly and indirectly impacted by the ₹ 6.05 crore that was raised in 2016. Direct impact is when children's education is funded, food and shelter of children & elderly is taken care of, medical aid provided to the unwell, livelihood training provided, support extended to start small enterprise through SHGs, mobility aids provided and corrective surgeries performed on the differently-abled, special education and treatment provided for the intellectually challenged... the list goes on...

Though like every year, we do not have the metrics of measuring the impact of a new school building, toilets built in communities, farmers supported, trees planted, medical camps, libraries.... but numbers do matter - these are direct and indirect impact on number of beneficiaries.


