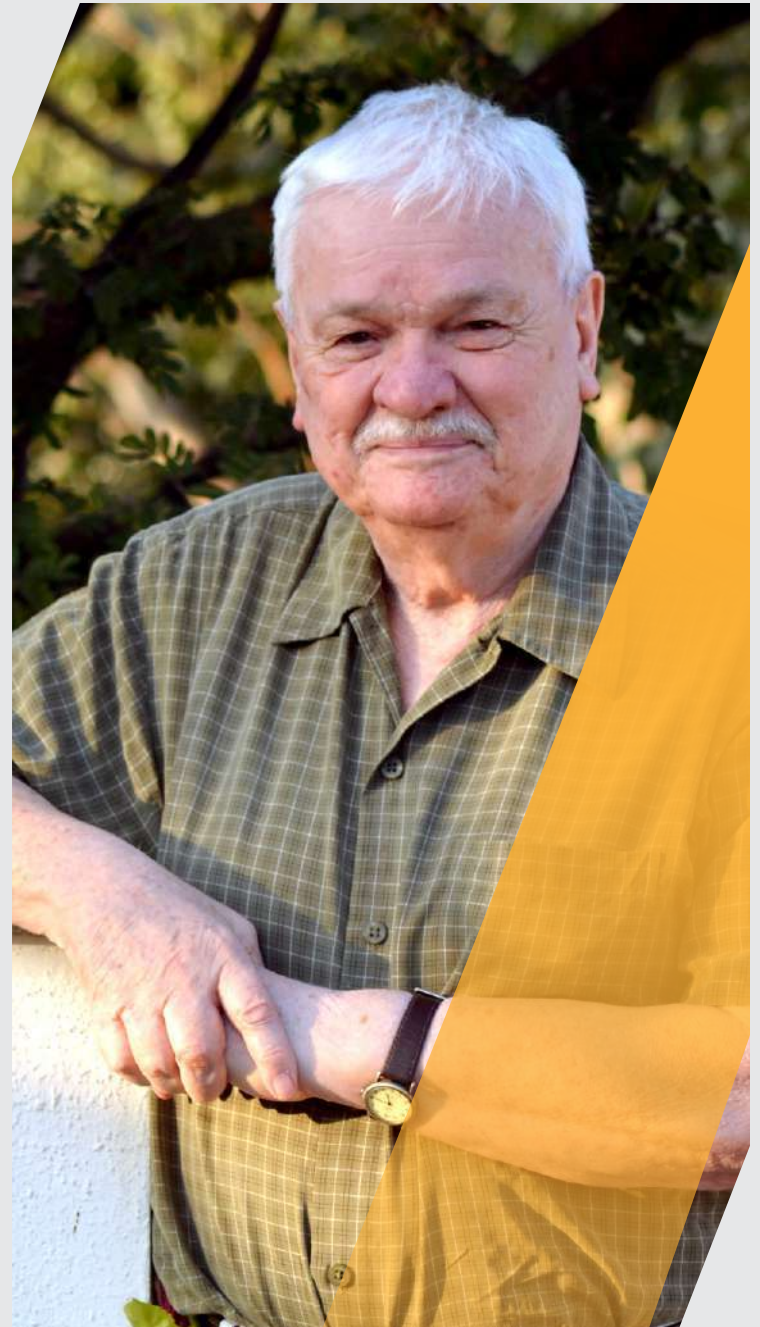

Our deepest wish is for many more CSOs to understand and utilise the platform to the fullest and more people to know the difference they can make!"

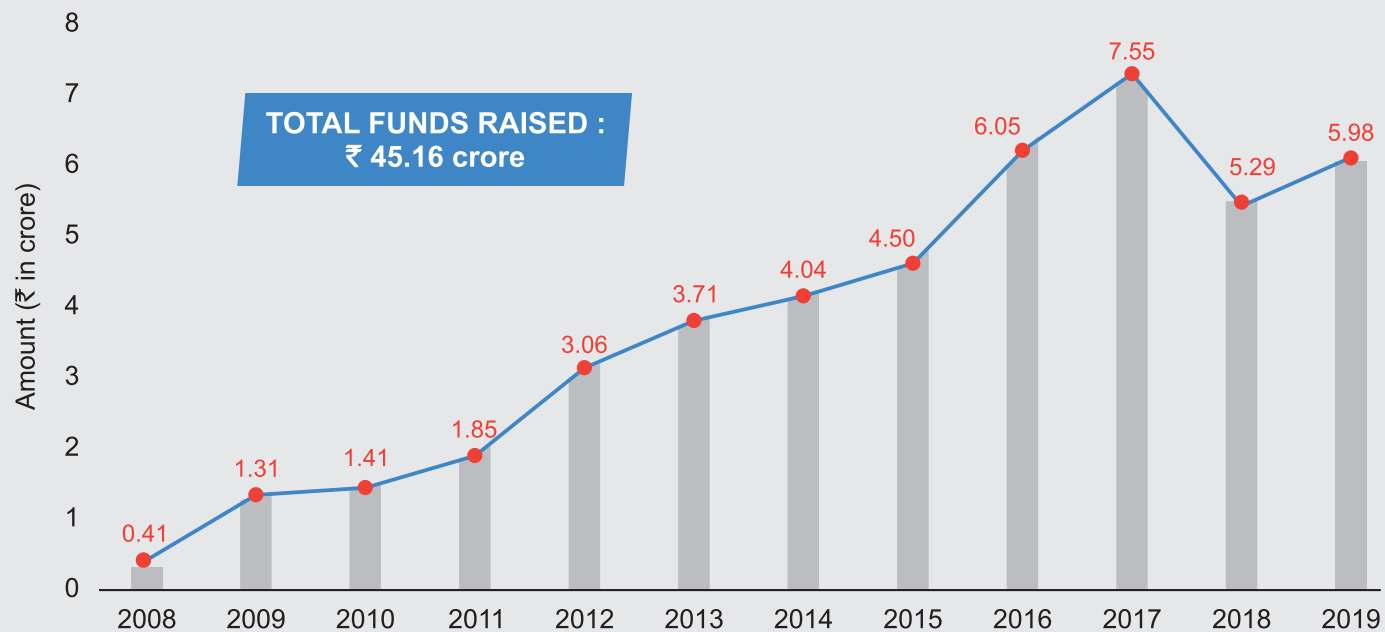

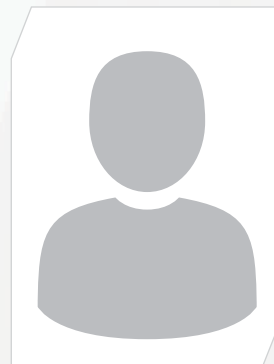

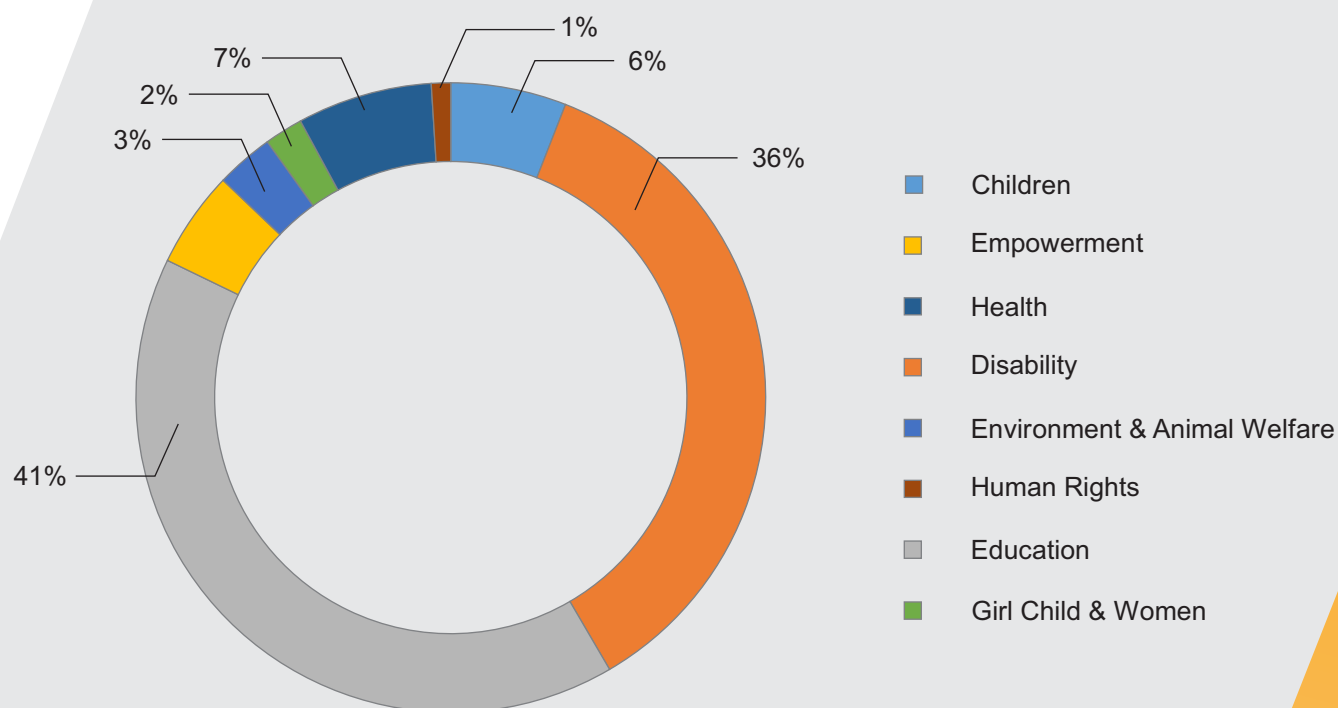
PARTICIPATING CSOs

Civil Society Organisations (CSOs/ NGOs) always struggle to get people to know about the work they do, their impact on Society and to get volunteers and funds on a continuity basis. A lot of traditional methods like grants is on the decline and sourcing of CSR funding is not possible for most of the small and medium CSOs due to bandwidth, area of work, connect to the CSR and lack of communication skills. Also CSR funding is for a specified, limited timeframe, post that for the project to continue, the CSO has to find other sources of funds.

For CSOs to organise Events to raise funds and awareness, takes up much time, resources and the cost is far higher than the funds raised. The TCS World 10K Bengaluru is a readymade cause neutral platform, of international standards, whereby the CSOs can reach out using this platform, set processes and systems, making it easy to reach out to people, new donors, volunteers and fundraise. The event also has utilisation reports and media exposure for building the transparency and credibility among donors, that rubs off all year round on CSOs. Every individual, associated with a CSO, all stakeholders, get an opportunity to work together towards growing the CSO.

Isha Vidhya is a compelling cause because of its mandate – it offers rural children high quality education on full scholarships or at heavily subsidized fees. This equips economically disadvantaged groups to break out of the cycle of poverty and compete on equal footing for mainstream income opportunities.

“Still, having a compelling cause, we realized, doesn’t automatically guarantee funds. On race day, we had only raised ₹ 42 lakhs, a far cry from our previous fundraising attempts at TCSW10K. This amount made everyone on the team shift gears and take our fundraising operations to the next level. We decided that in the 3 weeks after race day, we would pull out all stops to push the needle higher.”

Fundraising depends equally on compelling communication. That’s what the Isha Vidhya team did with diligence, perseverance and meticulous data gathering.

The most successful fundraisers put out their success stories for others to emulate. Top 20 fundraisers’ names were published and circulated to boost enthusiasm and encourage other fundraisers to get there. A center-wise break-up of funds raised was published. The message that was reiterated over and over was: no amount is too small.

The team pulled their weight in the 3 weeks after race day and went all out speaking to as many people as they could, encouraging donations of all denominations and communicating their cause with a passion and sincerity that moved hundreds of people to contribute.

proVISION ASIA works in supporting Persons With Disabilities by providing mobility aids such as wheelchairs, walkers, crutches, canes and blind sticks, specialized to fit specific disabilities in rural and urban areas across Karnataka, and also in hospitals, other NGOs, police stations, retirement centres and government offices. We have a few programmes:

- Mitra Special School for children with disabilities has a balance of academics, social, physical, aesthetic and spiritual growth along with training on sports management and physical wellness.
- For women, 'empowHER' project is a three-month certificate course that focuses on spoken English, basic computer skills and personal development.
- The 'Prison Project' is getting second hand, top-of-the-line wheelchairs, collected and sent by Joni and Friends International Disability Center, U.S.A., are refurbished by the inmates of Bangalore Central Prison to a like-new condition. Pediatric chairs, sports wheelchairs and various sizes of manual wheelchairs are fitted to individuals to assure the best mobility. These inmates, once deemed as outcasts in society now have found purpose.

All the above with Advocacy, Job Placements, Playgroup for kids, Rehabilitation Centre and a 'Friendship Circle' - a safe place for Persons With Disabilities to get together, share experiences, interact with volunteers and thrive.

"This was our 10th year at TCS World 10K; it is a part of our annual calendar, both to raise funds and to give our special need students and Persons With Disability community a chance to be a part of the Society. Go Global team in Singapore was our BIGGEST team this year, with over 16 people! They did a 10K along the beach and Bedok Jetty. proVISION ASIA is the dream of Dr. Chip Kingery, who we lost a few months ago, so we, along with our supported teams of friends from Australia, Texas, California and Philippines had to make sure that we do our best to make the organisation stronger. 77 MINUTES AND ₹ 2,150 - A SUMMER EXPERIENCE

First time runner and fundraiser, homemaker Shobha Narasimha's journey of fundraising for ISHA Vidya at the TCS World10K 2019 began with much enthusiasm. She created a campaign page and registered for the run in May when she heard about ISHA's campaign for education of rural children!

For two weeks she kept refreshing the campaign page, assuming all friends would have donated. She was surprised to see only one donation and lost hope of reaching even half of her target. She then started applying her creative mind and came up with plans to spread the message.



"I felt like a business woman. I treated it like my new product launched in the market - and every day I need to give it one hour. I calculated - if I have to raise ₹ 25,000 and if one person gives ₹ 1000, then I need to reach out to 25 people at least.

One of my last approaches was conducting storytelling sessions for children in apartments who can contribute money from their Piggy bank towards the cause. Akshaya Lakshmi a volunteer provided me a platform in her society. It was a heartfelt movement after storytelling and fun filled activities when kids donated many notes of 10s and 20s from their tiny hands - saying I want to put it first. When we counted the money, there was ₹ 2,150 in all, along with joyful tears in my eyes."

IMPACT OF FUNDS RAISED AT TCSW10K 2018

The TCS World 10K Bengaluru is all about connecting people to a chance of leaving a legacy for a cause they care about – for the vision of the world they want to see.

In 2018, we had from the Maharaja of Mysore, to a proactive 8 year old, many socially conscious citizens put their feet together to use the platform for Philanthropy - as bearers of change to the society!

Education and Disability (empowerment) came to the fore with the funds raised in 2018. Programs to educate children, keep them in school (with health & sanitation measures), after school activities and libraries impacted around 34,000 young individuals. Mobility Aids, Wheelchair provision, therapies and a much needed answer to “Who after me?” with action for a residential facility for intellectually impaired, have been provided at the other end of the spectrum.

As numbers, ₹ 5.29 crore raised in 2018 edition helped 227 women get livelihood support; 319 Intellectually Impaired; 533 Physically Challenged; 822 people on health issues like cancer, HIV; general health check up and awareness camps, hospice care; educate around 34,000 children; and 80 elders whose 3 months of stay, food and medicines got sponsored!

Innovative environmental impact was set in motion with 3,000 saplings planted using a Japanese method to create a 100 year-like forest, rich with fauna and flora within 15 years.



FINANCIALS OF FUNDRAISING

When a Civil Society Organisation - CSO/ NGO organizes an event to raise funds and build its visibility, the effort into doing this method of fundraising gives them a **40%** return on the higher side.

And at the TCS World 10K Bengaluru platform, the returns are as high as **90%**! The thought through and structured category wise opportunities to leverage the event by Civil Society Organisations (CSO/ NGO) allows every participating organisation, individual, group of people and/or company to maximize their fundraising potential for the chosen cause. There are three main categories through which funds can be raised - Care Champions, corporate participation and individual crowd fundraising.

Of the total funds raised by the participating non-profits, the management cost for India Cares to support the CSOs from January to June 2019 was **4.60%**. **13%** of the funds passed through India Cares accounts and **87%** was directly donated by the donor to the CSOs.

51% of all the retention is collected from the Corporate Cares participation category. **5%** of funds raised through India Cares online platform is retained. **100%** of all funds coming into India Cares bank account on behalf of any non-profit, is passed on and there is no retention from any of the funds that the donor donates directly to the chosen cause.

The actual retention and disbursement per participating non-profit is dependent on their utilization of each of the three categories. In its role as the TCS World 10K Philanthropy Partner, India Cares is committed to keep the overall administrative cost of fundraising to a maximum of **7%**.

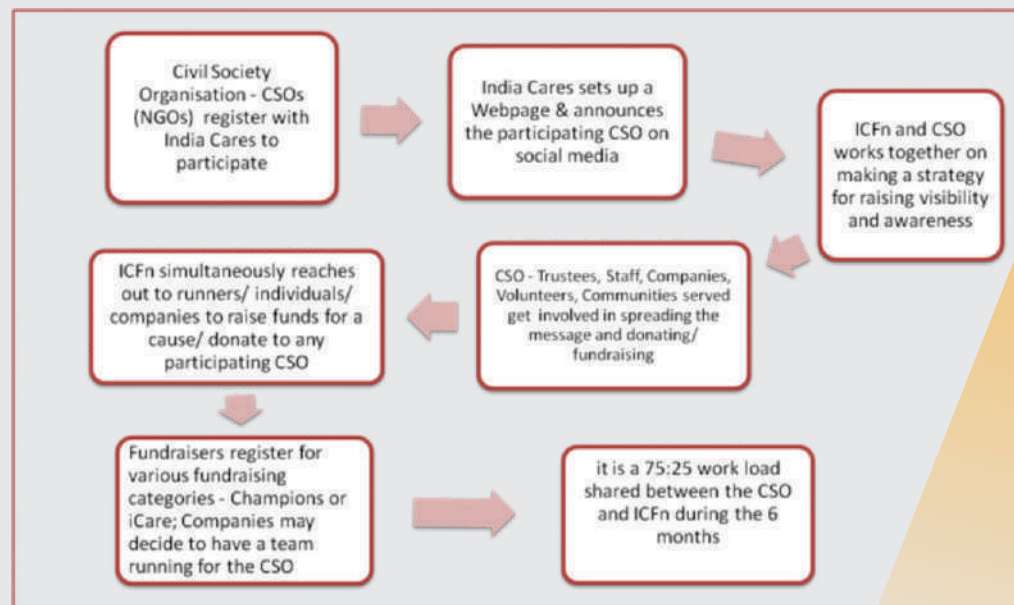

PROCAM SLAM



In a bid to recognize the ardent runner, the Procam Slam was launched in 2018; a rewards and recognition program for runners who complete four feature races in Procam's running calendar. 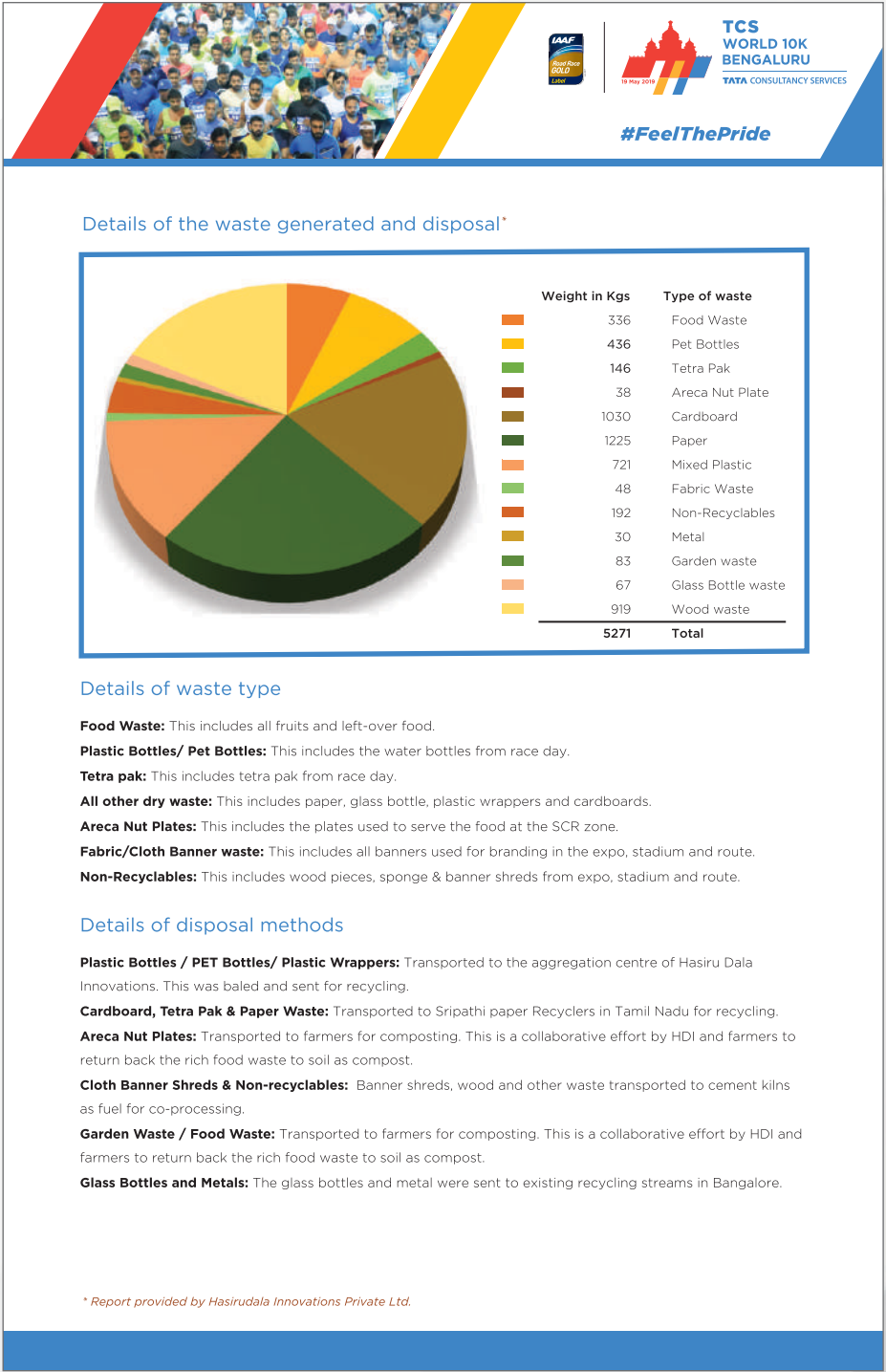

Belihu delivers for Ethiopia

Kenyans toppled in men's event. Tirop wins women's title in thrilling finish

BENGALURU: Andanek Belihu of Ethiopia and Agnes Tirop of Kenya emerged as champions in the men's and women's category with contrasting tactics at the TCS World 10K Bengaluru Sunday.

Belihu was the pace right from the start and pushed all the way to the end to break Kenya's hold on the men's title with a time of 27:26.

Surprise package Mandia Bushnick (20:22) of Uganda kept up with Belihu before fading back late and finishing with the silver while Barbara Legesse (22:22) of Ethiopia came in a close third.

This was the first time after the very first edition in 2009 that a Kenyan had won the podium at the race.

Tirop, the reigning champion in the women's category, retained her title by walloping off her Ethiopian rival in a photo finish after a close race.

Tirop, Legessebet Gelet and Barbara Legesse were given the same time of 25:08 but Tirop's split put the Kenyan clearly ahead of the other two.

Belihu wrestled control early, leading a pack of seven before Bushnick and Gelet-Fey Keenat of Kenya came to push the Ethiopian after the halfway mark. Tirop was off from the pack along with Bushnick, leaving Keenat and Legesse behind ahead of the Ken men and then Tirop.
